# Background

The Hon'ble Prime Minister had mandated the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG) to hold virtual conferences/webinars with District Collectors and other Officers over the next 12 months. A specific themes/sector may be taken up in each month, in which past award winners since the inception of the Scheme under that sector be invited to present their experiences.

In his address on the occasion of Civil Services Day, 2022, the Hon'ble Prime Minister suggested that training institutes should conduct virtual Sessions of 1-1.5 Hours with the award winners as the Lead Speakers, to disseminate the best practices.

Accordingly, DARPG and NCGG jointly conducted 13 National Good Governance Webinars, one webinar a month on different themes, on the last Friday of every month, over the year 2022-2023. The purpose of the Webinars is to highlight and disseminate the best practices and sharing of experiences of the award winning institution to facilitate replication by other States/Districts.

Thirteen (13) Webinars have been held in the last thirteen months from April, 2022- April, 2023, on the PM award winning initiatives on the themes 'Improving Public Service Delivery'; 'Health'; 'Aspirational District programme'; 'Public Grievance Redressal', 'Environment', 'Public Participation (Jan Bhagidari) through Swachh Bharat Mission', Innovations at District, State and Centre levels, 'Jal/Water Management' and 'Namami Gange'.

These webinars were attended by about 1000 officials from Ministries/ Departments, State Governments and District Collectors. Given the encouraging response, it has been decided to continue the initiative of organizing the National Good Governance Webinar Series in the year 2023-2024. For the year 2023-24, a total of twelve Webinars have been planned.

In this backdrop of the National Good Governance Webinar Series, DARPG, in collaboration with NCGG, has convened the 17th Webinar on PM's Award Winning Initiatives under the theme "Aspirational District Programme" on August 31st, 2023.

# Overview

NGGWS

The Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances has initiated a unique initiative of organizing National Good Governance Webinar Series on a monthly basis from April 2022, which has been very popular amongst practicing administrators. Very large participation has been observed in the 13 Webinars held upto April 2023. The Hon'ble Vice President of India released the compendium of the National Good Governance Webinar Series 2022-23 on 20th April 2023 in the inaugural session of Civil Services Day events 2023. It has been decided to continue the initiative of organizing the National Good Governance Webinar Series.

The awardees present their exemplary work in these National Webinars, to highlight the best practices adopted by the award-winning initiatives for replication by other States/Districts. Doing so would also infuse a new spirit and enthusiasm among administrators and other stakeholders involved in the implementation of different government programmes. These webinars covering Award Winning Initiatives help in broadening of skills, dissemination of best practices as well as in replication of best practices.

A total of twelve Webinars have been planned (14th – 25th Webinar) from May 2023 to April 2024, one Webinar a month on the last Friday of the month, on different themes under the good governance initiative that have been felicitated with the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration. Webinars would cover multiple areas like Health, Education Sports, Har Ghar Jal, Aspirational Districts Programme, Innovations, One District One Product (ODOP), PMSVANIDHI Yojna etc., wherein the initiatives have bagged the award for their exemplary work. The webinar series are fully documented.

## **Initiative in Aspirational District 'Baramulla' in the state of J&K**

The Aspirational Districts initiative in Baramulla, Jammu & Kashmir, has driven substantial progress in crucial sectors: healthcare, education, agriculture, and the economy. In healthcare, Birth Waiting Wards improved services at PHCs and CHCs, Poshan Tracker Tabs were given to Anganwadi workers, and Smart Kindergarten complexes promoted pre-primary education. This resulted in a notable reduction of Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) to 0.01% and a drop in Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) from 11.93% to 0.039%. A two-year paramedical diploma course addressed workforce shortages. In education, Atal Tinkering Labs fostered innovation, Block Resource Centers provided teacher training, Lab schools implemented creative teaching methods, and libraries became accessible in schools, block headquarters, and Panchayat Bhawans. In agriculture, mechanization, plant protection, and high-density apple planting supported farmers, enhancing apple quality and quantity. Financial inclusion through PM Jan Dhan Yojana accounts and coverage under PM Jeevan Jyoti Beema Yojana and PM Suraksha Bima Yojana was significant. Youth empowerment included skill development and vocational training, improving employment prospects and nurturing local entrepreneurship.

### **Speaker - Dr. Syed Sehrish Asgar**

Dr. Syed Sehrish Asgar, an IAS officer from the 2013 batch, Punjab cadre, serves as Baramulla's Deputy Commissioner in Jammu & Kashmir during an inter-cadre deputation. She holds a medical degree and was previously an IPS officer in the 2012 batch. Her career has encompassed roles such as Deputy Commissioner of Budgam, Director of Information and Public Relations in Jammu & Kashmir, and Managing Director of the National Rural Livelihood Mission (JKRLM). Dr. Asgar was honored with the prestigious PM award for excellence in public administration in 2023 for her transformative efforts in Baramulla. She has also received SKOCH awards for women's empowerment initiatives and played a vital role in positively presenting constitutional changes in the region after the 2019 developments.

## **Initiative in Aspirational District 'Gumla' in the state of Jharkhand**

The district administration implemented a holistic approach to development with inter-departmental convergence, focusing on Key Performance Indicator (KPI)-based initiatives. Partnerships with private organizations like Tata Steel CSR, Hindalco CSR, the Hans Foundation, Azim Premji Foundation, and Piramal's played a crucial role in health and education initiatives. A district-wide survey identified 1,153 households engaged in bamboo crafting, leading to the distribution of toolkits and cluster-level support. Common Facilitation Centres were established, enhancing managerial activities and expanding the reach of healthcare institutions. Efforts to train and empower 226 nurses, Auxiliary Nursery Midwifery (ANMs), and attendants resulted in improved health indicators. An Empowered District Skill Committee was established to monitor training for youth in NSQF-certified trades. The impact of these initiatives includes breaking monocropping practices through the innovative Ragi Mission, significant increases in agriculture production, expanded farmer registrations, and improved access to government benefits. Solar-based irrigation systems, empowerment of bamboo artisans, and educational programs have contributed to all-around development, including improved healthcare and education outcomes.

### **Speaker - Shri Sushant Gaurav**

Shri Sushant Gaurav, a native of Ranchi, Jharkhand, is an IAS officer from the 2014 batch, belonging to the Jharkhand Cadre. His career has seen various significant roles, including Probation in Garhwa District, SDM in Ghatsila (East Singhbhum District), and District Development Commissioner (DDC) in Palamu and Deoghar. He has also served as the Director of Higher Education and as the Deputy Commissioner (DC) in Simdega and Gumla. Notably, Sushant Gaurav holds a degree in Electrical Engineering from BIT Mesra and has a strong academic background. He has achieved distinctions such as being a Man of the Match in the All India IAS vs. IPS cricket match, breaking records in the 100m sprint among IAS officers, and receiving awards for election-related work. He was also the first officer from the Jharkhand Cadre to receive the PM Award for Excellence in Public Administration.

He mentioned that the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India has directed that all the efforts should be made to replicate and disseminate good governance practices particularly those of the

Prime Minister's award-winning initiatives. So far, 16 National Good Governance Webinars have been conducted on the last Friday of every month from April, 2022.





## Proceeding Report

These webinars covered gamut of themes including public service delivery, health, aspirational districts programme, grievance redressal, environment, Jan bhagidari, innovations at district, state and central level, Jal & water management and namami gange. More than 1250 senior officials from the various Ministries, Departments, State Government, and District Collectors have participated in these webinars.

During the Civil Service Day 2023 Inaugural Session held on 28th April 2023, the Hon'ble Vice President of India released a compendium on the National Good Governance Webinar Series. This release serves as a testament to the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances' highly successful initiative, the National Good Governance Series - he added.



He further introduced the lead speakers of the webinar on 'Aspirational District Programme' to present their initiatives i.e. on the Aspirational District 'Baramulla' in the state of Jammu and Kashmir and

Aspirational District 'Gumla' in the state of Jharkhand.

# Session - I

## 1st Session – Initiative in Aspirational District ‘Baramulla’ in the state of Jammu & Kashmir

Dr. Syed Sehrish Asgar, Deputy Commissioner of Baramulla district in Jammu & Kashmir, delivered an insightful presentation on the theme 'Aspirational District – Baramulla.' The presentation outlined the district's challenges, opportunities, and notable achievements across various sectors, showcasing remarkable progress in healthcare, education, agriculture, infrastructure, and more.

### Challenges

Dr. Asgar began by highlighting the significant challenges faced by Baramulla district:

- i. **Difficult Terrain:** The region's challenging topography presents logistical difficulties and infrastructure constraints.
- ii. **Hostile Neighborhood:** The district grapples with security challenges due to its proximity to a volatile border.
- iii. **Harsh Weather Conditions:** Extreme weather conditions pose a challenge to the overall development and livelihoods of the population.
- iv. **97 km Volatile LOC (Line of Control):** Frequent disruptions caused by the LOC's proximity affect the normal functioning of the district.

## Opportunities

Despite these challenges, the district has harnessed several opportunities:

- i. Tourism: Baramulla boasts significant potential for tourism, offering scenic beauty and cultural experiences.
- ii. Agriculture & Allied Activities: The agricultural sector, including high-density apple plantations, mushroom cultivation, and bee farming, has gained prominence.
- iii. Skill Development & Sports: Initiatives to promote skill development and sports activities among the youth have shown promise.
- iv. Agro-Based Industries: The development of agro-based industries has added to the district's economic potential.



## Key Initiatives and Achievements

Dr. Asgar highlighted various initiatives and achievements in key areas:

### Institutional Delivery

- i. Establishment of Birth Waiting wards in PHCs and CHCs.
- ii. Upgradation of diagnostic services, including USG machines at all delivery points.
- iii. Upgradation of labor rooms at the primary level and OTs and ERs at the secondary level.
- iv. Establishment of new SNCUs and NRCs at the secondary level.
- v. Skilled Birth Attendant (SBA) program for tribal nomadic populations.

### Nutrition

- i. Distribution of Poshan Tracker Tabs to Anganwari Workers.
- ii. Ensuring 100% pregnant women receive supplementary ration through various initiatives.
- iii. Implementation of a decentralization policy allowing PRIs to determine balanced diet recipes for beneficiaries.

### Child Immunization

- i. Door-to-door vaccination campaigns.
- ii. Capacity building of ANMS/ASHAs regarding infection control practices and use of PPEs/BMW.
- iii. Establishment of District/Block control rooms for follow-up of routine immunization.
- iv. Taskforce for monitoring, including NQAS certified PHCs.

## **Education**

- i. Establishment of 154 smart Kindergarten Complexes to mainstream Pre-Primary Education.
- ii. Mainstreaming of out-of-school children (1564 identified) in the age group of 6-14 through the Talash OOSC survey.
- iii. Establishment of Model Academic Schools, equipped with advanced labs.
- iv. Transformation of schools into Smart Schools, CAL Schools, and Lab Schools.
- v. Introduction of Atal Tinkering Labs.

## **Agriculture & Allied Activities**

- i. Achieving top ranks in agriculture at the national level.
- ii. Focus on high-density apple plantation.
- iii. Promotion of landless agriculture, including mushroom cultivation and bee farming.
- iv. Establishment of high-tech poly houses for indoor agriculture.

## **Financial Inclusion & Skill Development**

- i. Extensive coverage of social security schemes, bank accounts, and self-employment schemes.
- ii. Establishment of industrial training institutes and the Centre of Invention Innovation Incubation and Training (CIIT).
- iii. Formation of women's self-help groups and skill development programs.
- iv. Mobilization of youth under the Back to Village initiative.

## Healthcare

- i. Establishment of a medical college.
- ii. Improved healthcare coverage, including deworming, vaccination, and livestock insurance.
- iii. Focus on water resources rejuvenation and access to portable water.

## Awards and Recognition

The district received several awards, including the Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration 2022 and NITI Aayog challenge mode awards.

## Conclusion

Dr. Syed Sehrish Asgar's presentation on 'Aspirational District – Baramulla' underscored the district's resilience in overcoming challenges and capitalizing on opportunities. The initiatives and achievements outlined in the presentation highlight Baramulla's remarkable progress in various sectors, bringing about positive change in the lives of its residents.



# Session - II

## 2nd Session – Initiative in Aspirational District ‘Gumla’ in the state of Jharkhand

Shri Sushant Gaurav, Deputy Commissioner of Gumla district in Jharkhand, delivered a comprehensive presentation on the theme 'Holistic Development in Saturation Mode' through the Aspirational District Programme. The presentation highlighted the district's remarkable progress and achievements in various sectors, showcasing a unique approach to holistic development.

### **Agriculture Development & Allied Activities**

- i. Ragi Mission: A transformative initiative that led to the shift of 5,549 trained small and marginalized farmers from paddy cultivation to ragi in 2022-23, resulting in a 270% increase in production and a 219% expansion in the net sown area.
- ii. Ragi Processing Center: A dedicated center, operated by all-women Farmer Producer Companies (FPC), processes ragi, producing 1 MT of ragi flour, 300 packets of ragi laddoo, and 200 packets of ragi snacks under the brand 'Johar Ragi.'
- iii. Expansion of Ragi Cultivation: More than 30,000 acres of farmland were dedicated to the second phase of ragi cultivation in FY 2023-24.
- iv. Irrigation: Utilizing solar-based lift irrigation projects, PMKSY drip irrigation interventions, pond renovation, and percolation tank construction, the district increased irrigated agricultural land by over 4,400 hectares.

v. Diversification: Introduction of high-value crops such as strawberries, pears, and dragon fruit, along with the cultivation of lemon grass and sericulture in Don & Tand lands.

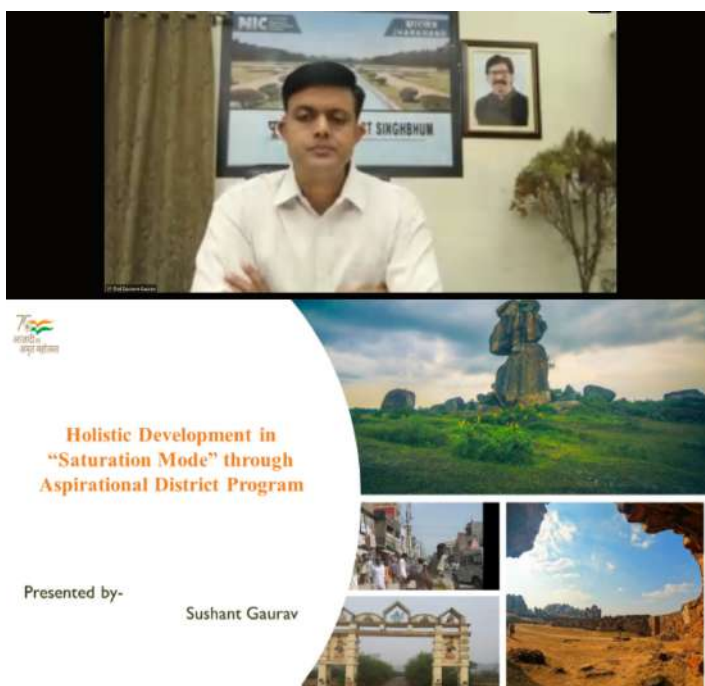
vi. Organic Farming: Approximately 5,000 farmers engaged in organic farming cultivation projects.

vii. Farm Mechanization: Critical support provided in terms of irrigation pumps, mini-tractors, rotavators, and power tillers to support Tana Bhagat and PVTG families.

### Health, Nutrition & Wellness

i. Medical Equipment: Hospitals equipped with portable digital X-ray machines, CT scans, and digital Hb meters for ANMs. Addition of 14 new mobile medical units to various CHCs.

ii. TB Eradication: Nutritious food packets provided to all 522 TB patients through "Ni-kshay Mitra." The district is on track to achieve TB-free status by March 2024.



iii. Nutrition & Anemia: 100% household survey for malnutrition and anemia testing for school-going children, pregnant women, lactating mothers, and AWC children. Ragi ladoo distributed to identified SAM and MAM children during weekly VHSND meetings.

iv. Health Infrastructure: Construction of new MTCs and renovation of existing ones. Improvement in bed occupancy to an average of 80%.

v. Disability Survey: For the first time, a 100% household survey for all 21 types of disabilities resulted in the identification of 8,208 new Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) who are now receiving support.

vi. Health Monitoring: Weighing scales and height charts installed in all schools to monitor the development progress of students.

vii. Nutritional Awareness: Awareness campaigns conducted for 52 types of local leafy green vegetables to promote their nutritional benefits.

viii. AWC Upgrades: Upgradation of 401 AWCs into model AWCs, leading to institutional deliveries crossing 89% for the first time.

### **Education, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship**

i. Library Revolution: Establishment of libraries in all Panchayat Bhawans, Block HQs, and two mega libraries at the district level.

- ii. Foundation Learning: 'Padhe Hum Badhe Hum Abhiyan' addressed foundational learning gaps in 62% of students (Class I to V).
- iii. Smart Classrooms: Residential hostels and KGBVs equipped with smart classrooms, interactive panels, PA systems, CCTVs, and solar rooftop power plants.
- iv. Science Labs: All secondary and senior secondary schools provided with new science labs.
- v. Infrastructure Improvement: Electricity connections, functional toilets, and tap water connections provided to all 1,331 government schools, improving from 50.8% in electricity and 83.9% in functional toilets.
- vi. Skill Training: Outcome-based skill training in fashion designing, embroidery, and sanitary napkin production. Over 706 students trained in personality development and life skills.
- vii. Community Mobilization: Participation of three villages in a fisheries development project through modular cage aquaculture, generating substantial profits.
- viii. Artisan Empowerment: Bamboo artisans provided with modern toolkits, bamboo-craft development centers established. Traditional crafts like Mandar making, brass, and bronze were revived.
- ix. Employable Skilling: Training of 105 PVTG and Tana Bhagat youths in employable skills.

## **Basic Infrastructure, Sports Development & Governance**

- i. Infrastructure Expansion: Construction of indoor stadiums at three sub-division HQs, one football ground in all 159 Gram Panchayats, and 11 open gyms promoting a healthy lifestyle.
- ii. Solar Power: Installation of solar-based street lights, high mast lights, and rooftop solar power systems, ensuring clean energy supply.
- iii. Digital Connectivity: Installation of 115 mobile towers, with 94 more in progress, improving network connectivity. Broadband Bharat Net connections established in all Panchayat Bhawans.
- iv. Road Construction: 532 kms of all-weather roads constructed, connecting all habitations to PMGSY roads.
- v. Human Resource: Recruitment of 551 employees in various departments, filling critical gaps.
- vi. Municipal Development: Renovation and furnishing of commercial centers, installation of CCTV cameras for surveillance.

## **Conclusion**

Shri Sushant Gaurav's presentation on 'Holistic Development in Saturation Mode' showcased Gumla's impressive journey towards comprehensive development. The district's innovative initiatives in agriculture, healthcare, education, and infrastructure have yielded remarkable results, improving the lives of its residents. Gumla is on track to transform from an aspirational district to an inspirational one.

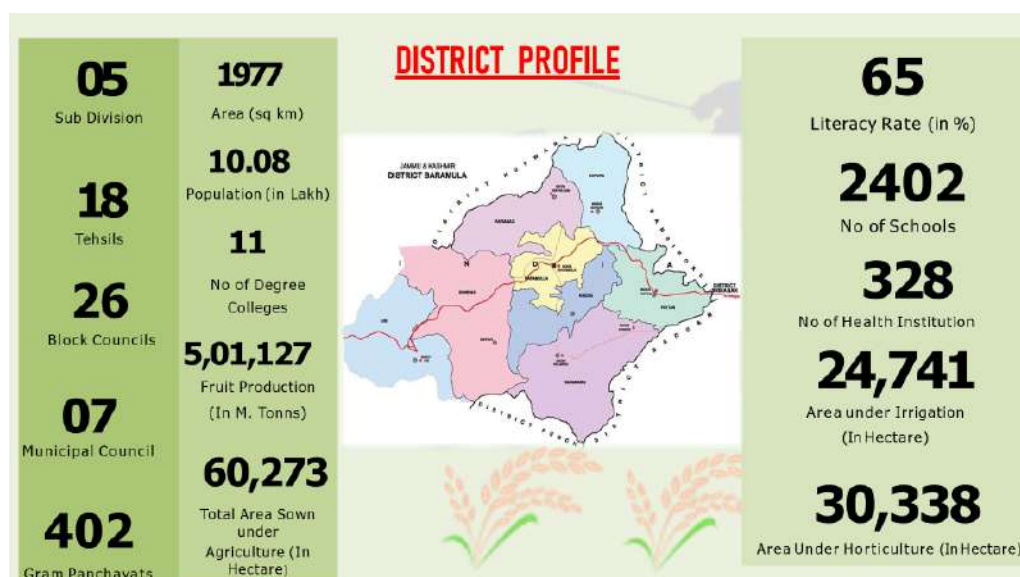
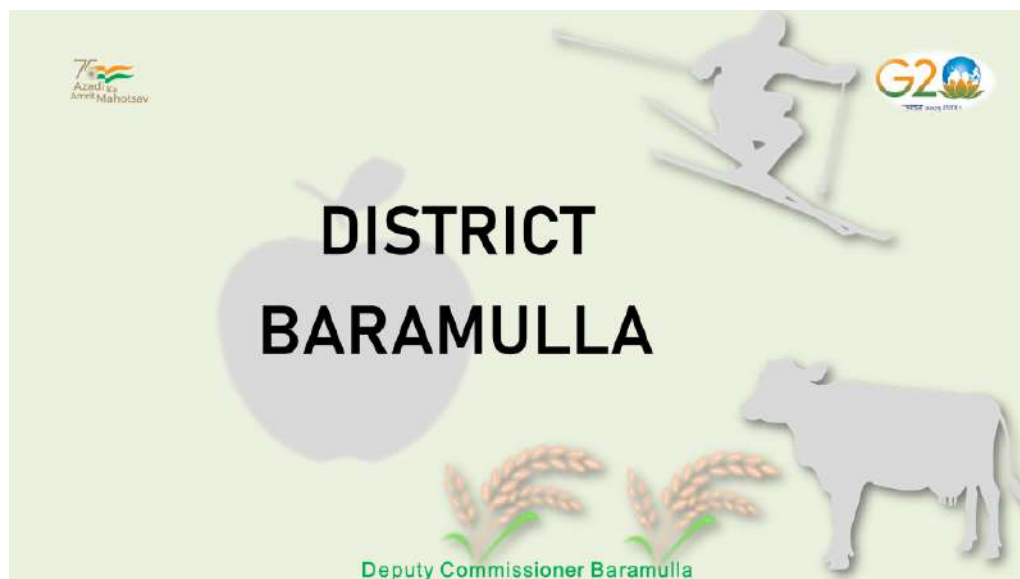

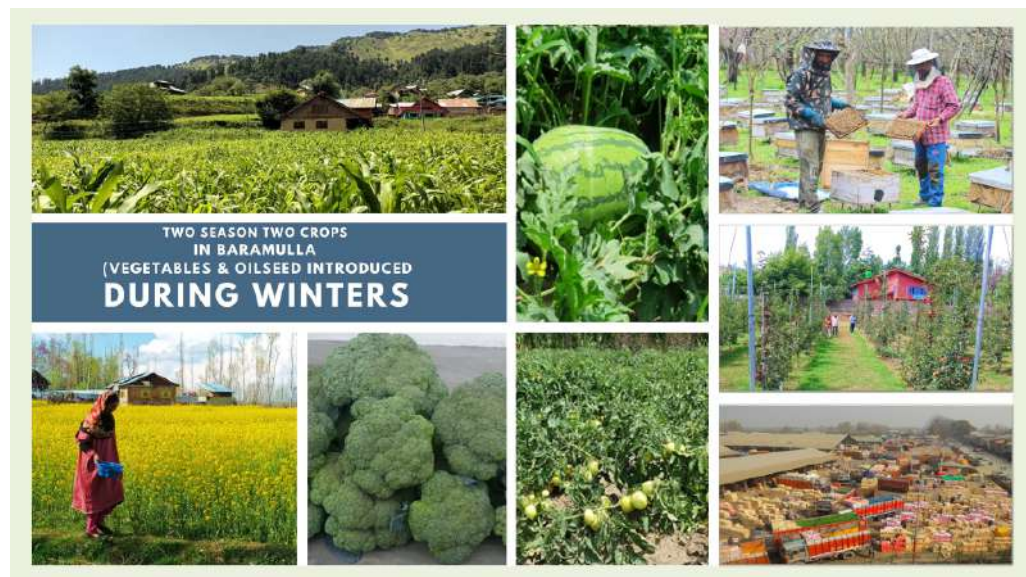

## Agriculture Development & Allied Activities

1. Agro-climatic suitability and monocropping practice led to the introduction of Ragi Mission wherein 5549 trained Small & Marginalized farmers in 3500 Ha shifted from Paddy cultivation to Ragi in cultivation in 2022-23.
2. Compared to last 5 year's average, an increase of 270% in production and 219% in net sown area for Ragi crop in 2022-23.
3. Thereafter, procurement and processing of Ragi at dedicated **Ragi processing center** owned and operated by all women FPC. The center ensures daily production of 1 MT Ragi flour, 300 packets of Ragi Ladoo and 200 packets of Ragi snacks under the Brand **Johar Ragi**.
4. Tremendous success in the whole process prompted a district wide participation in FY 2023-24 wherein more than 30,000 Acres farming land have been used for 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase of Ragi Cultivation.
5. Through 150+ Solar based lift irrigation projects, PMKSY drip irrigation interventions and pond renovation as well as percolation tank construction, an increase of more than 4,400 ha irrigated agriculture land has been achieved. On the one hand, the district is now, a net exporter of vegetables and on the other hand, introduction of high value crops such as strawberry, pears & dragon fruit have been a major success.
6. Don & Tand land is now used for lemon grass (805 acre) and sericulture (114 acre) cultivation.
7. Around 5000 farmers directly engaged in **Organic Farming** cultivation project.
8. Value enrichment of NTFPs through PM Van Dhan Kendras- 175 MT Tamarind, 94 MT Karanj, 700 MT Mahua through 600+ SHG women making Dori Oil, Mahua Ladoo & Pickles, Tamarind Cake etc.
9. **Critical farm mechanization** support of 314 irrigation pump, 30 Mini-Tractors, 31 Rotavators and 27 Power Tillers to 1900+ Tana Bhagat and PVTG families lacking this support for long time.

## Health, Nutrition & Wellness

1. Hospitals were equipped with portable Digital X-Rays machines & CT Scan and provision of one digital Hb meter per ANM and 14 new mobile medical unit to various CHCs.
2. All 522 T.B Patients are being provided nutritious food packets through volunteer, “Ni-kshay Mitra”. The district will achieve T.B Mukht status by march, 2024.
3. 100% HHs survey for malnutrition; and Anemia testing for 100% school going children, PW, LM and AWC children. All identified SAM and MAM children are now provided with one Ragi laddoo during weekly VHSND meet.
4. All MTC discharged children are followed up with **innovative Blue Card** to avoid slip back.
5. 2 New MTC constructed & rest 2 MTC renovated. Bed occupancy improved to an average of 80%.
6. **For the first time ever**, 100% HH survey for all 21 types of disabilities was done. It resulted in the identification of 8208 new PwDs. Subsequent beneficial support are being provided to all of them.
7. All schools supplied with weighing scale & height charts painted on walls to monitor development progress of students.
8. 52 types of local leafy green vegetables were identified whose widespread awareness was ensured for their nutritional benefits.
9. 401 AWCs in dilapidated condition were upgraded into model AWCs. Additional provision of ANC beds resulted in 100% ANC checkup thereby institutional deliveries crossed 89% for the first time.



## Education, Skill Dev. & Entrepreneurship

1. **Library Revolution**- At all 159 Panchayat Bhawans, all 12 Block HQs and 2 new mega libraries at district level.
2. **Padhe Hum Badhe Hum Abhiyan** plugged foundation learning gap by 62% amongst 9529 students (Class I to V).
3. All Residential Hostel and KGBVs provided with Smart Classrooms, Interactive Panels, PA systems, CCTVs and Solar Rooftop power plants.
4. All Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools provided with new Science Labs.
5. All 1331 Government schools provided with electricity connections, functional toilets and tap water connections, thereby improving from 50.8% in electricity & 83.9% in functional toilet in the year 2019-20.
6. Outcome based Skill training in KGBVs - in Fashion Designing, Embroidery and Sanitary Napkin production under NIESBUD and 706 Students trained under **Personality Development and Life Skill Training** program.
7. All 199 Secondary and Senior secondary schools have been provided with boundary walls in the last 2 years.
8. **Effective Community Mobilization** : 03 villages participation facilitated in a Fisheries Development Project (Net profit of 0.70 Cr in 1 fishing cycle) through Modular cage aquaculture under supervision of Fisheries College, Gumla.
9. One Poultry Cluster Federation of more than 300 SHGs engaged in Egg Production and Poultry Enterprise generating Rs. 12.30 Cr annually.
10. 100% HH survey led to identification 1153 bamboo artisans, all of them were provided with Modern and Advanced **Bamboo craft toolkits** and clustered into 8 groups. Each cluster facilitated with one Bamboo-craft development and production center.
11. Reviving Traditional Craft **Mandar Making, Brass and Bronze** (development of clusters and formation of producer groups)
12. 105 PVTG and Tann Bhagat youths trained under employable skilling schemes through NSQF qualified trades with an initial monthly salary of Rs 14,500.
13. More than 150 SHG didi trained under **Solar Mama Project**.
14. Trained and certified more than 5000 Tribal youths under PMKVY, DDUGKY, NULM, RSETI, PMKK, JSDMS and Kalyan Gurukul.

2. Unique initiative of **Sports Bank** : It has ensured that talented poor youths are honing skills in their sports with best of the equipment with no out of the pocket expenditure.
3. Agriculture Equipment Bank (**Custom Hiring Centre**): 21 CHCs owned and operated by SHGs have been made functional in the district.
4. Promoting healthy lifestyle & Swasth Gramin Bharat through **11 Open gyms** at district and subdivision level.
5. Installation of 4,000 Solar based Street Lights, 80 Solar High Mast Lights, more than 500 KV Roof Top solar power energy in all important locations ensuring safety, security and clean energy supply.
6. **Digital Asset Register** for real time project monitoring and evaluation of ongoing and finished schemes.
7. One of the most critical gap of **Network connectivity** has been filled through 115 mobile towers installation. Another 94 mobile towers is in the process of installation which will ensure zero habitation under network shadow area in the district.
8. All 159 panchayat Bhawan connected with Broadband Bharat Net connections wherein CSCs/ Pragma Kendra provide digital services to remote rural population.
9. 532 Kms of All Weather roads constructed in the last 2 years. Also, 100% Habitations of the district are now connected to PMGSY roads.
10. 551 new recruitments on compassionate grounds, Frontline Health Workers & in Education department thereby filling up critical human resource gap.
11. The major commercial centres of the only municipal body of the district like Bazar Tand, Bus Stand & Bazar Samiti in the have been furnished with much needed facilities and upgraded to the needs of all relevant stakeholders. Furthermore, the entire municipal area is now being surveillance through more than 150 CCTV cameras from the newly renovated and well-furnished Control Room.



Gumla has achieved significant progress in Health, Agriculture, Nutrition, Education, Infrastructure & Governance through unique and ongoing projects such as Ragi Mission, Padho Likho Abhiyaan, Anemia & Kuposhan Mukh Bharat, Sports Bank, Library Revolution, substantially improved network connectivity etc. which ensured holistic development in a short span of time in a saturation mode.

We believe that through constant support from Central & State government, Gumla will complete its journey from being an Aspirational to become an Inspirational district by March 2024.

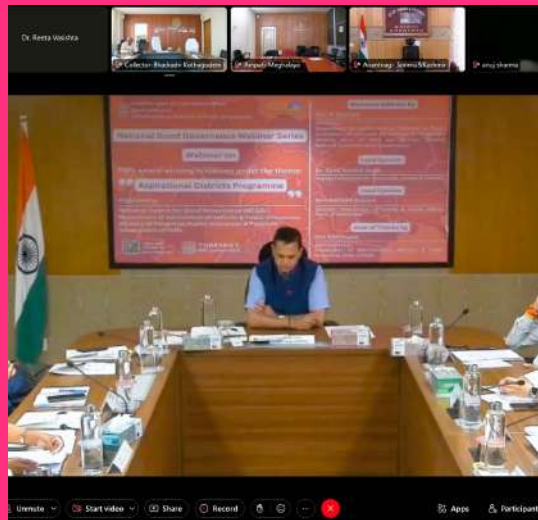
