BACKGROUND

To realize the vision of the **Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi** of a self-reliant India, the NCGG under the aegis of the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, Government of India is organizing the National Good Governance webinar series for the year 2022-2023. These webinars covering Award Winning Initiatives which will help different stakeholders to broaden their skills, as well as to attain new knowledge that can supplement or complement their work areas.

The thirteen webinars are based on different themes and sectors under the good governance initiative that have been felicitated with the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration. Award winning nominations under the PM Awards since the inception of the scheme which have proved replicable and sustainable will present their experiences.

The purpose of conducting the webinars is to highlight the best practices and award-winning achievements to create a precedence for other states/UTs to follow. Doing so would also infuse a new spirit and enthusiasm among administrators and other stakeholders involved in the implementation of different government governance schemes.

As a part of the National Good Governance Webinar Series (NGGWS), NCGG has convened the 13th Webinar on “**Building of efficient greenhouse to grow crops**” - **Government of Ladakh** – and “**Data driven transformation of school education system –“Vidya Samiksha Kendra”**- **Government of Gujarat** on 27th April,2023.

BRIEF CONCEPT- “INNOVATION- STATE”

The Hon’ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi, announced the launch of “Startup India, Standup India” initiative on 15th August 2015. The Initiative aims at fostering entrepreneurship and promoting innovation by creating an ecosystem that is conducive to growth of Startups. Further to this, an Action Plan for Startup India Initiative was unveiled by the Hon’ble Prime Minister of India on 16th January 2016. The initiative strives to provide a long-due impetus to the entrepreneurial setup in economic landscape of India. It has been established globally that startups are driving the economic growth of nations, creating employment, and fostering a culture of innovation.

It is therefore incumbent on the Government of India to nurture emerging talent and entrepreneurship as part of the larger goal of Atmanirbhar Bharat. The objective is to make India a nation of job creators instead of just job seekers. The Government of India has been making efforts towards making the vision of the Startup India initiative a reality. Startup India is a flagship initiative of the Government of India, intended to catalyse startup culture and build a strong and inclusive ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship in India.

Innovation and creativity are vital to achieving progress in socio-economic, education-, healthcare- and agriculture-related fields. R&D will lead to increased productivity, expand the markets, and create employment and wealth. As the world grows more competitive and we confront a number of difficulties—including climate change, new technologies that are reshaping business models, and, most recently, the Covid-19 pandemic—innovation is more important than ever. India has begun to carve a path towards an enabling environment by establishing an ecosystem that fosters innovation. As emphasized by the Prime Minister in his appeal for an Aatmanirbhar Bharat, innovation is critical in promoting the country’s resilience and self-reliance and now it’s essential to sought the decentralisation of innovation across all Indian states

NGGWS – Webinar Report

Innovation in the form of knowledge accumulation and better human capital promotes economic growth. In the same manner, increasing economic growth fosters higher levels of knowledge capacity and an improved quality of human capital. Thus, there is a bi-directional causality relationship between economic growth and innovation, but the direction and the strength of the relation depends on the development status of the nation and in the developing countries, innovation is not only associated with economic growth but also with poverty alleviation, reduction in inequality, and increase in social mobility.

The India Innovation Index 2021 presents state-wise rankings based on the innovation landscape and performance of the country's states and union territories. The latest framework of the index has been mapped from the Global Innovation Index, published annually by WIPO (World Intellectual Property Organization). The new framework presents a more nuanced and comprehensible outlook for measuring innovation performance in India, with the introduction of 66 unique indicators as against the 36 indicators used in the previous index. Thus, the index provides a report card of every state and union territory's performance; it identifies its strengths and weaknesses that will help policymakers to include and frame relevant measures to foster innovation-led growth at the sub-national level.

INAUGURAL SESSION – WEBINAR

WELCOME AND INAUGURAL ADDRESS SRI V. SRINIVAS IAS,
SECRETARY, DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS &
PUBLIC GRIEVANCES, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA

Sri V. Srinivas (IAS) Secretary, Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances, Government of India commenced the inaugural session by extending his warm and hearty welcome to the distinguished lead speakers, Directors of State ATIs, State AR Secretaries, State IT Secretaries, District Collectors, IAS Probationers from LBSNAA, Officer Trainees from State ATIs etc.

He mentioned that the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi on the auspicious occasion of Civil Services Day held on April 21st 2022 mandated DARPG to conduct virtual conferences with State Governments and District Collectors over the next twelve months, to disseminate award-winning initiatives which have been conferred the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration in the past years since its inception in 2006. Hence The Central Government through DARPG we are making lot of efforts and comprehensively revamping the whole system of public grievance disposal. Various states also taking various initiatives and some of the states have done outstanding job in this regard. Now today we have to outstanding Civil servants who had done excellent work in their own districts and this gives an opportunity for us to listen to them how they went about, what are the challenges they faced and what are the issues which other districts can basically tackle. Through this platform They can get in touch with officers directly also and they can devise how experience from these two districts and from these two officers can be replicated in other states and districts.

SESSION-I- “BUILDING OF EFFICIENT GREENHOUSE TO GROW CROPS” - GOVERNMENT OF LADAKH”

Lead Speaker

The temperature in Ladakh drops down to – 30C in winter. Long harsh winters reduce the cropping season to just 4-5 months in a year. Ladakh remains cut-off for six months in a year due to heavy snowfall. The availability of fresh vegetables decreases significantly during the winter months resulting in an unbalanced diet. Seasonal shortfall and low dietary diversity among the local populace manifests as micronutrient deficiencies, a phenomenon that has been described as hidden hunger.

The objective of innovation

Ladakh Greenhouse Scheme was to improve food security and promote livelihood in Ladakh. Farmers needed a technology which will enable them to produce vegetables in winter months. Prior to the initiative a large number of passive solar greenhouses have been established in Ladakh. However, the traditional greenhouses have limitations w.r.t the temperature inside the greenhouse dropping to -6 to -10 c at night in winter, only leafy vegetables can be grown in winter, restricted plant growth in December and January and majority of farmers do not use the greenhouse during summer months due to excessive heat. The Agriculture Department of Ladakh took initiative of building efficient greenhouses designed to overcome the existing processes of traditional Greenhouses with many advantages

Above freezing temperature: the temperature inside the efficient greenhouse remained above freezing points even in December and January. Therefore, plant growth is more vigorous in winters

Increased variety of vegetables: A variety of crops are grown in peak winter in efficient greenhouse which otherwise is not possible in traditional greenhouse

Fixed cladding material: The polycarbonate sheet is fixed. There is no need to remove the cladding material even in summer months, unlike polyethylene sheets in traditional greenhouse

Durable cladding material: average service span of polycarbonate sheet is 15-20 years in Ladakh condition. It withstands high wind speed and extreme climatic conditions f Ladakh region

Withstand snow load: Triple layer polycarbonate as cladding material is suitable for regions receiving heavy snowfall. The smooth curved design allows snow to slip off. The structure withstands the load of snow which remains on it.

INITIATIVE – “DATA DRIVEN TRANSFORMATION OF SCHOOL EDUCATION SYSTEM – “VIDYA SAMIKSHA KENDRA”- GOVERNMENT OF GUJARAT

Lead Speaker

Education Department of Gujarat was functioning on manual process for governance like many other states. Daily attendance of students and teachers, assessment results etc was taken and kept at the school level. Reports on field visits and review by district officials were also maintained in physical form. Compilation of huge data in silos was almost a formality. Due to lack of appropriate systems and formal assessment there was no triangulation of data to find out the reasons for lower learning outcome and remedial needs. There was absolutely no convergence in tracking of schools run by other departments like tribal welfare, social justice and private schools. 2. Stakeholders including parents are required to know the progress of students and how they achieve grade appropriate learning outcome by bridging the learning and governance gap. Technologyenabled online real-time monitoring and support was identified as the most effective means to improve accountability and effectiveness. Education department has 2.5 lakh government teachers, 10,000 supervisory staff. Effective monitoring and support system through the use of modern technology was felt to be the key to success of all initiatives.

Initiative:

- A series of technology and data-driven reforms were undertaken like Daily Online Attendance of students and teachers, centralized summative and periodic assessments, accreditation of all schools, online real-time monitoring of all field staff, the launch of Ed-Tech Company by the name Gujarat Education Technologies Ltd and a host of other initiatives.
- Over 500 crores + data points are generated annually. Command and Control Centre for Schools authenticates, analyses and visualizes these data for meaningful actionable insights for all stakeholders. Taking data-driven decision-

making to the next level, the Education Department has created a holistic school education dashboard – School Excellence Dash Board – Artificial Intelligence, Big Data and Machine Learning are used to design the School Excellence Dashboard so that important metrics stand out and are easy to access. Improving stakeholder accessibility to the data they need enables informed decision making regarding academics, governance and administrative policies.

- There was no summative or formative assessment in the state till grade 10. After the introduction of PAT & SAT for all grades, analysis of data has provided the insights related to State > District > Block > cluster >School >Grade>Subject> Student – level assessment data, learning outcomes, school accreditation scores along with real-time tracking and monitoring of cluster resource coordinators and a video conference facility directly with the schools.






Praveshotsav 2.0: Data Driven Approach for improving Enrolment

- Gujarat took lead in integrating the data of Health Department with UDISE Based Child Tracking System of Education Department from 2019.
- Birth Records from Civil Registration System (CRS) was utilized to identify the children eligible for admission in Grade 1 in 2019.
- Intensive monitoring and follow up mechanism through VSK to ensure maximum enrolment and timely data entry in Government and Private Schools.
- All of these efforts resulted in improved enrollment and in timely updation of UDISE Database

Daily Online Attendance of Students and Teachers

- NEP 2020, Chapter 7.7 recommends using ICT-tools for Regular Attendance, as it is one of the most important factors for improving the quality of education.
- Daily Online Attendance System was launched in 2018-19 across all Government Primary Schools to track the attendance of all the Students and Teachers across the State.
- This system was extended to all Government and Private Schools in the State from June, 2019.
- Today daily online attendance of 11.5 million Students and 3.98 lakh Teachers across 54,273 Government and Private Schools is received at VSK.
- Within first year of its implementation, Students having more than 80% attendance are increased by 26% i.e. 13.5 Lakh Students became more regular.

Strengthening Foundational Learning – NIPUN

Bharat

- NEP 2020 recommends to ensure proficiency of Reading, Writing and basic Maths.
- Statewide diagnostic Assessment (Nidan Kasoti) of about 6.5 lakhs
Students studying in Grade 2 in the month of February every year since 2019.
- 60 days long remedial program during February to April every year followed by volunteering by Teachers during vacation for continuous remediation.
- School Readiness Program for all Students Enrolled in Grade 1
- Balvatika (Pre-school) to be introduced in schools from June, 2023.
- Integration with ICDS to track the Children in Anganwadis through Child Tracking System.

Centralised Summative and Formative Assessments for Grades 3 to 12

- Centralized Summative Assessments were introduced to ensure assessment of Grade Appropriate Learning Outcomes across Grades 3 to 12 across all Government Schools from October 2018, twice every year.
- Uniform timetable, centralized question papers, invigilation and evaluation of papers by teachers of other Schools was introduced.
- Learning Outcomes-based Centralized Formative Assessments were introduced from December 2018 where every week one subject is assessed for which Student-wise Answer Books are given to all the students.
- Centralized data entry of results is being done for about 4.5 million Students across Grades 3 to 12 for all subjects for every question and answer.
- To be extended to Private Schools.

Centralised Summative and Formative Assessments for

- This large repository of data running into about **500 Crore plus data sets every year** is analyzed through VSK using AI and ML
- This gives us State wise analysis of achievements across all Learning Outcomes of all Subjects from Grade 3 to 12
- Gujarat is the first State to offer Learning Outcomes based Report Card for every student, all subjects, across Grades 3 to 12.
- **Total of 17 Crore Report Cards** have been generated till now.

Gunotsav 2.0 - School Accreditation

- Gunotsav 2.0 launched in 2019-20 with a scientific approach for standardized **Accreditation** of all
- Gujarat School Quality Accreditation Council (GSQAC) formed.
- About **500 Teachers deputed as School Inspectors**.
- During 2020-21, Gujarat became the first State to accredit all of its 32,500 Government Primary Schools.
- **Three Cycles of Accreditation have been completed**.
- **School Report Cards** generated and shared with Schools.
- Report Cards help Schools in their Annual School Development Plan.



Launch of India's first Government owned Edtech Company

Gujarat is the first state to launch its own Edtech Company — **Gujarat Education Technologies Limited (GET)** in March 2021.

- GET is providing **world class e-content to Government School Students at zero cost** and at a highly affordable cost to the Private School Students.
- GET has launched its **eContent app ‘G-SHALA’** which has over 3 million plus downloads.
- All IT driven education initiatives in State are being implemented through GET.



G-Shala : Digital Learning Content & LMS

(Gujarat Students' Holistic adaptive learningApp)

- G-SHALA is an eContent app for Std. 1 to 12 for all 100 subjects with 1500 chapters
- Digital interactive 2D/3D augmented e-Content mapped with textbooks for all the subjects, including Science & General streams in Std.11-12
- Platform/Device Agnostic,immersive eContent for all students, real-time Learning Management System (LMS)
- Comprehensive question bank mapped with Learning Outcomes for Assessment
- Self-Learning & Self-Assessment modules for students



School Administrative Software (SAS)

School Head Teachers are engaged in various non-teaching activities like Payroll management; Managing Service Book of Teachers; Updating School Infrastructure details.


- In 2019-20, introduced School Administrative Software (SAS) - an integrated web application for primary schools to reduce the workload of Head Teachers significantly.
- Head Teachers now put in more time for academic work.
- Details of teachers retiring each month are available in advance, therefore, pension files are created in time.
- **8 Lakh Average monthly logins** at the State, District, Block, Cluster and School levels.
- **Estimated savings of about 1.25 Crore man hours of Head Teachers every year.**
