It is pertinent to mention that NCGG has till date trained 1206 civil servants including Permanent Secretaries, Secretary Generals and High-Level Delegates from Maldives over a total of 39 Capacity Building Programmes in Field Administration for the Civil Servants of Maldives following the renewal of the MoU in August, 2024 to train 1000 civil servants.



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
